# INTRODUCTION

The Esperance Farm Training Centre (EFTC) is a campus of Esperance Senior High School. The farm is 820ha and is located on the south coast, 35km north of Esperance and 723km south-east of Perth.

The farm enterprises include broad acre cropping of barley, wheat, canola, oats and lupins, beef cattle production, prime lamb production, wool production and specialist programs in stud cattle (Red Angus) and stud sheep, and Emergency Services Cadets.

Our goal is to provide quality education and training for the agricultural related industries that meets the needs and expectations of our students and the wider community.

We have students from Year 10 to 12 that start on the pathway towards their completion of a Certificate II in Agriculture (National Training Package - AHC20116).



# WORK PLACEMENTS

Students complete a block of work placement each term. This usually take place towards the end of each term but may vary depending on seasonal timings (e.g. seeding, lambing, shearing and harvesting). Placement will often be on farms but can be in related businesses.

# TRAVEL

There are two buses that leave from the bus bays of the school each morning at 8:35am to transport students to the farm. Buses return before 3:00pm to allow students to catch their bus home.

# LUNCH

Students are required to bring their own lunch as there is no canteen onsite. Students will have access to a kitchen area that has a microwave, urn, toaster and a sandwich press.

# DRESS CODE

Students attending the Esperance Farm Training Centre are expected to wear the following items of clothing at all times.

- Long Sleeved Hi-Vis Shirt
- Steel Capped Boots
- Hat

EFTC Logo Shirts can be purchased through the Registrar in the Esperance Senior High School Front Office.

At the EFTC our Year 10 students experience all aspects of an agricultural education that link directly into Year 11 and 12 pathways. The Year 10 program is made up of a combination of Australian Curriculum and "real" on-farm experience, aimed at providing a broad introduction to all aspects of farming enterprises and to enable them to make informed choices when selecting their Year 11 and 12 pathways.

Each week students will complete Australian Curriculum courses in English, Maths, Science, Humanities and Social Sciences, Health and Physical Education over approximately three days, with the other two days spread across the farm and the workshop. Our students also start Level 1 Emergency Services Cadets training which is an endorsed program.

## **Driver Training Program**

Our Year 10 students have the opportunity to take part in the Department of Education Driver Training Program, which is unique to the Western Australian College of Agriculture. Once a student is 15 years old, the training can begin and they progress through the licensing system until they are able to operate all of the vehicles and machinery on the farm. This training is competency based and related to the completion of the Certificate II in Agriculture. More information will be sent to parent/guardians once the student is enrolled in the course.

## **Cadet Unit**

This is a hands-on training initiative, designed to take students out of the classroom in order to offer them a range of opportunities that promote youth leadership.

The activities undertaken are designed to develop teamwork, community service, leadership, individual responsibility, self discipline and confidence.

Upon successful completion of the program, students will have gained an accredited first aid certificate and a chainsaw operator ticket that will be credited towards their Certificate II in Agriculture. Cadets learn a diverse range of emergency service skills, develop their leadership potential and are encouraged to explore a career pathway or ongoing volunteer with emergency service; as the program has a focus on "building the next generation of emergency service volunteers".

# **YEAR 11 AND 12**

Students in Year 11 and 12 complete a Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) and a Certificate II in Agriculture (from South Regional TAFE).

While at the EFTC, students will be enrolled at TAFE in Certificate II in Agriculture and complete English, Maths, Animal Production Systems, Materials Design and Technology: Metals, all at the General level to gain the required credits for WACE.

As part of the Vocational Education and Training program, students will also complete blocks of Workplace Learning (WPL) in agriculture related industries. This gives our students a chance to gain valuable experience and improve their knowledge and skills.

## AHC20116 Certificate II in Agriculture

The EFTC will offer 18 units, three of which are complusory<sup>\*</sup>, over a two year period. Some students may start units in Year 10 but will only be resulted on completion of these units in Year 11 or 12. In Year 12, students will also specialise in their choice of cropping or livestock units.

## Primary Industries Agriculture – 2024

Welcome to Esperance Farm Training Centre and the Primary Industries Course for 2024.

To make the transition into the course as smooth as possible you will need to supply:

#### Stationary supply:

The stationary supply for Year 10, 11 or 12 students may be purchased from Campion Education using the enclosed order form, or alternatively, you may purchase items locally.

#### <u>Uniform</u>

The uniform is to comply with Work Health and Safety requirements. All uniforms will need to be in a sound condition and regularly cleaned.

Esperance Farm Training Centre has some uniform shirts available for purchase at cost of \$50 for two yellow hi-vis long sleeve shirts with EFTC logos. You will need to confirm size availability. Once remaining stock are sold, all future uniform sizes will be available through Haslams – 8 Andrews Street, Esperance. Long work pants and steel capped work boots can be purchased at a number of businesses within Esperance.

Uniform requirements:

- Plain broad brimmed hat,
- 2 x Safety Glasses AS1337 one tinted, one clear,
- At least 2 yellow high visibility work shirts. These sometimes need to be replaced throughout the year,
- A dark blue windcheater with EFTC logo available through Haslams.
- 2 x pairs of work pants (Blue), and
- Steel cap work boots (preferably zip up as students are required to remove boots before entering the classroom).

#### Agricultural Shows and Camps:

Attendance of Agricultural Shows is not compulsory. Attendance is dependent on the individual student's inclusion to the show team. EFTC can assist with some items as needed for Agricultural Shows. Information regarding requirements is listed below:
