Primary Industries Agriculture – 2025

Welcome to Esperance Farm Training Centre and the Primary Industries Course for 2025.

To make the transition into the course as smooth as possible you will need to supply:

Stationery supply:

The stationery supply for Year 10, 11 or 12 students may be purchased from Campion Education using the enclosed order form, or alternatively, you may purchase items locally.

Uniform

The uniform is to comply with Work Health and Safety requirements. All uniforms will need to be in a sound condition and regularly cleaned.

Esperance Farm Training Centre has a small supply of uniform shirts available for purchase at a cost of \$50 for two yellow hi-vis long sleeve shirts with EFTC logos. You will need to confirm size availability. Once remaining stock are sold, all future uniform sizes will be available through Haslams – 8 Andrews Street, Esperance.

Long work pants and steel capped work boots can be purchased at a number of businesses within Esperance.

Uniform requirements:

- Plain broad brimmed hat
- 2 x Safety Glasses AS1337 – one tinted, one clear.
- At least 2 yellow high visibility work shirts. These sometimes need to be replaced throughout the year due to wear and tear.
- A dark blue windcheater with EFTC logo available through Haslams.
- 2 x pairs of work pants (Blue).
- Steel cap work boots (preferably zip up as students are required to remove boots before entering the classroom), and
- One hi-vis wet weather jacket (available from Haslams).

Agricultural Shows and Camps:

Attendance of Agricultural Shows are not compulsory. Attendance is dependent on the individual student's inclusion to the livestock show team. EFTC can assist with some items as needed for Agricultural Shows. Information regarding requirements is listed below:

To be provided by the students:

- Dark blue & black denim jeans
- Long-sleeved plain, white, buttoned shirt
- Black or brown belt
- Dark brown or black dress boots (for example clean Rossi boots) for parading and judging.

As part of the Primary Industries Course, Agricultural Shows and camps are listed below:

A letter of interest will be provided for each camp to gauge interest with confirmed dates, requirements and costs. Further permission slips, health forms, itinerary and a requirement list will be supplied. Fees for camps list below are approximate.

Camp Description	Estimated maximum cost per student
Agricultural Show – Wagin (6 th to 9 th March)	\$250
Agricultural Show – Beverly (Mid August) – dates to be confirmed)	\$250
Agricultural Show – Perth Royal Show (24 th September– 5 th October 2024). This is anticipated to include the Rural Skills Competition before the Perth Royal Show	\$800
Agricultural Show – Esperance	No Cost to students
Agricultural Show - Albany (early November- dates to be confirmed)	\$250
Department of Fire and Emergency Services Cadets Camp (- dates to be confirmed)	No cost to students; fully funded by Cadets WA.
